Chapter Event Highlight: Denver Chapter Young Alumni Stranahan's Distillery Tour

Last May, in an effort to broaden the diversity of their chapter event participants, the Denver Hokies took a look at their Young Alumni programs and decided to try something different.

In the last several years, Denver has become a hot spot for not only local breweries but also fine craft alcohol. Stranahan's Colorado Whiskey lays claim to being the first Colorado-born whiskey using handcrafted distilling techniques and local ingredients.

Chapter leaders identified this trend as having the potential to attract some new participants and organized a tour and social specifically targeted to area young alumni.

Chapter volunteer Kelly Dillon '10 reserved the time and tour spots and publicized the event as an exclusive for "Denver Hokies Young Alumni."

The limited availability was sold out, with 25 young alumni attending. They enjoyed an hourlong tour, sampled products, and socialized afterward in the tasting room. The group then moved on to enjoy dinner in the restaurant together.

Of the 25 total participants, 10 of them had never attended a Denver Chapter event. This resulted in a great mix of familiar faces and new friends. Many of the new attendees were excited to learn more about the chapter and have continued to attend events.

The Virginia Tech Alumni Association was pleased to present the Denver Chapter with the Broadening Alumni Engagement Award at the 2015 Chapter Officers Forum. This event epitomizes the intent of "broadening engagement," as the chapter worked to develop an intentional strategy for including more alumni from their area. A member since 2007, Matt served as the president of the Virginia Tech Alumni Association board of directors from 2013 to 2015. He also served as the chair of the Alumni Services and Communications Committee, the Nominations and Awards Committee, and as vice president.

Matt was a member of the Virginia Tech Real Estate Foundation Board of Directors, the Pamplin College of Business Advisory Council, and the Virginia Tech Foundation Board of Directors. He was also a member of the Virginia Tech Black Cultural Center advisory board from 2003 to 2006. He is an active member of the Council for the Advancement and Support of Education (CASE), which recently awarded him with the 2015 Distinguished Service Award.

Matt is a second-generation alumnus of Virginia Tech. His father, Matthew Winston Sr., received his bachelor's degree in aerospace engineering in 1959 and is one of the university's early black graduates.
