Community Service Highlight: Oklahoma Chapter Accepting Donations for Tornado Victims

On the afternoon of Monday, May 20, 2013, an EF5 tornado struck Moore, Oklahoma and adjacent areas, killing 24 people and injuring 377 others. People across the country watched helplessly as victims sifted through the remains of their homes, looking for anything left behind.

Virginia Tech alumnus Brian Rock '07 is the Assistant Director of Housing and Food Services at the University of Oklahoma.

We received the following update from Brian:

"My department is currently housing 375 displaced victims of the tornado and another 300 first responders. We have turned our office into a 24 hour operation providing food and shelter for guests and emergency workers. We are a donation point, FEMA, Red Cross, Disaster Relief operational site registering guests and supporting government agencies.

Our community has really pulled together. What we do still need are gift cards for gas, groceries, mediation, etc. Any support is greatly appreciated and is being registered and distributed through the appropriate agencies to ensure it is reaching the right people. It has been an incredible 3 days so far; very eye opening, an incredible learning experience, and very heartwarming. The stories being shared are remarkable."

Student Picnic Requests

If you are planning to advertise your student picnic through the Alumni Association and want to invite students, please let <u>Ginny Ritenour</u> know **by June 7, 2013**. We don't need any additional details at this point; just a notification of your intent to invite students to an event this summer. The Alumni Association has to request student information from the Registrar's Office, and it can take up to two weeks to receive. By compiling a list and making the request early, this will help avoid delays in the process.

Please note that an email request that includes student invitations may take up to 10 business days, instead of the usual 5 business day turnaround. Notifying us ahead of time gives us an opportunity to reduce turnaround time as much as possible.

Annual Password Changes

PID passwords are required to be updated on an annual basis. Although you should receive an email reminder from Virginia Tech, June and July are the most popular "update required" months and we encourage you to go ahead and change your password at your earliest convenience. If your password expires, you will not be able to log-in to the Chapter Database for email/mailer requests, chapter reports, and other forms. Once expired, you will be required to phone Virginia Tech's 4-Help hotline to have your password reset.
